Welcome

For what reasons did Christ add the Sacraments to the Word? So that our weak faith be sustained and preserved in this way. For our mind cannot so easily assent to the sole and bare Word and firmly rely on it. For though, when the general promise of the Gospel is heard, one indeed in general does not mistrust it, yet in the matter of a conscience troubled, and disturbed by temptations, one usually falls into doubt as to whether that general promise belongs and pertains also particularly to him and whether he can and should also apply it personally to himself. Therefore Christ, who is rich in mercy, instituted outward and visible sacraments to help our infirmity on this point; through them, as testimonies that are open and strike the eyes, He Himself wants to deal with us and thereby, as by a very sure seal and pledge testify that He truly applies, confirms, and seals the promise of the Gospel individually to those who use these sacraments in true faith. Doubtless the Son of God works effectively through these His sacraments in believers, strengthening and preserving faith in them.

At Zion, the bulletin and Lutheran Service Book (LSB) are both used to lead us through our worship. To help guide you during the service, below are some helpful tips.

- For each section of the Divine Service, the page number in the hymnal is listed in the bulletin on the right side of the page, i.e., *LSB 184*, which is found towards the front of the hymnal. All responses are sung unless they are printed in the bulletin.
- P indicates sections spoken by the Pastor. C indicates responses by the Congregation and will be in **bold** print.
- All hymns are listed in the bulletin with the name of the hymn and page number, i.e., *Thy Strong Word LSB 578*. They are also shown on the Hymn board at the front of the church.
- The *red text* in both the bulletin and the hymnal shows when the congregation should stand or sit during the Divine Service. The Pastor may also provide direction.

A Special Welcome to Those with Young Children

At Zion we want families with children to feel at home.


- First, please relax and enjoy your time here. Jesus knows that children tend to wiggle and squawk a bit, so please don't feel embarrassed by it. Your children are welcome at Zion.
- To make it a bit easier on your family, please dare to sit toward the front where your children can easily see the front of the Church, note the colors, watch the pastor, wonder about the stained-glass windows above the altar and embrace the action at the altar. What Jesus does here promises to engage them.
- As we go, softly explain the Liturgy to your children, encouraging them to chime in on their parts: Amen! Lord have mercy! And with thy Spirit! I believe! Our Father! All of that belongs to them too.

- Be sure to sing and say and pray your parts too as you stand and sit. Your children learn by following your lead.
- If you and your child must leave, please hurry back. We want you and your children here very much.
- If you need a little help, just ask. There are lots of folks here who will lend you a hand.
- Please know that while you are caring for your children, the rest of us will be rejoicing in Jesus' words, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these" (Luke 18:16).

We know that your children are a gift to the Church, so we will do our best to welcome, smile, encourage, help and bless you all. Welcome to Zion!



Old Testament Reading

The Old Testament reading for the Fifth Sunday After Trinity is from First Kings, the nineteenth chapter.

And after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake. And after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire. And after the fire the sound of a low whisper. And when Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his cloak and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. And behold, there came a voice to him and said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" He said, "I have been very jealous for the LORD, the God of hosts. For the people of Israel have forsaken your covenant,

thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword, and I, even I only, am left, and they seek my life, to take it away." And the LORD said to him, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus. And when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael to be king over Syria. And Jehu the son of Nimshi you shall anoint to be king over Israel, and Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah you shall anoint to be prophet in your place. And the one who escapes from the sword of Hazael shall Jehu put to death, and the one who escapes from the sword of Jehu shall Elisha put to death. Yet I will leave seven thousand in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him."

So he departed from there and found Elisha the son of Shaphat, who was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen in front of him, and he was with the twelfth. Elijah passed by him and cast his cloak upon him. And he left the oxen and ran after Elijah and said, "Let me kiss my father and my mother, and then I will follow you." And he said to him, "Go back again, for what have I done to you?" And he returned from following him and took the yoke of oxen and sacrificed them and boiled their flesh with the yokes of the oxen and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he arose and went after Elijah and assisted him.






Proper Preface






Distribution

Bible Study Review

"Encountering the Divine"

Previously in Bible Study, we reviewed the "Proper Preface". We continue our study on the Proper Preface.

What is the Proper Preface? Well, it is after the Preface and it is usually chanted by Pastor. It begins "It is truly meet, right, and salutary that we should at all times and in all places give thanks to You, holy Lord, Almighty Father, everlasting God, through Jesus Christ our Lord." This is the beginning of the prayer because 1) it extends what the congregation previously said it was going to do from the preface, namely, "give thanks and praise." 2) It introduces what we give thanks and praise about.

This middle part of the prayer is always prayed in conjunction with the specific part of the church year. So, the Proper Preface for Christmas is very different than the Proper Preface for Easter. Why? Because at Christmas, we celebrate specific things, like "the Word of God made flesh (John 1:14)" or the love of God being physically manifested to the world through Jesus (John 3:16). But at Easter, we celebrate totally different things. We celebrate the resurrection of the Crucified Jesus, who sacrificed Himself as the sacrificial Passover Lamb so that we may be raised to new life in Christ. The middle part of the Proper Preface 1) teaches us what the specific themes of the church year are, 2) gives shape to our "thanks and praise" as it centers around what God has done for us, 3) teaches us about the life of Jesus, and 4) demonstrates the actions of love Jesus has towards His people – the very same Jesus we are soon to receive in the Sacrament.

Currently in Bible Study, we are observing the middle portions of the Proper Prefaces throughout the Church Year. So, if you've ever wondered why we do the church year or talk about certain aspects of Jesus life at certain times, come to Bible Study and grow in the edifying Word of Christ!
